Info	Project Team Meetings: The last project team meeting, with all programme coordinators took place last December; before that there has been no meeting during an entire year, as KH3000 issues were always discussed during Framework Programme meetings; → That's the reason why the decision has been taken to not have separate project team meetings for KH3000 anymore, but to include KH3000 issues in the PRO-SIT (Programmsitzung) meetings instead → this also strengthens the approach of KH3000 being part of the programme as a whole (Additional meetings will take place occasion-related)  Steering Committee Meetings: The label of the committee, composed of representatives of the MOs who contribute financially to KH3000, has caused some

Info	<ul> <li>Budget exhaustion: in many regions some budgets remained although planning foresaw its exhaustion (CA, EA, SEN and MOZ); this is unfortunate as it was already too late to use budget otherwise (e.g. IT solution for PP-files)</li> <li>Remaining ADA funds go back to ADA, remaining MO funds are transferred to the current project phase (will be deducted from the upcoming rate) by EP</li> <li>Note: IT solution for PP-files and its funding is being assessed now.</li> <li>Sigrun asks whether we can expect objections from ADA, as many regions didn't use the entire budget → KK doesn't think so, since the reports give easily traceable reasons for that (situation in Nicaragua, etc.) – also the overall exhaustion of the global budget is still quite high.</li> <li>Regarding the final reports, EA, ETH, PNG, SEN, CA have sent their narrative reports (MOZ is still pending; information will be "recovered" by KK and Daniela Pfeffer); Kristina is compiling the report and will share it with the MO as soon as it is completed.</li> </ul>

	<ul> <li>Discussion points:</li> <li>Matthias asks why CoPs predominate in CA, while in EA trainings outweigh all the other KM tools. KK states that CA decided in 2016 to try out the method, while EA did not find itself "fit" enough for that "experiment" - in EA the strong focus on trainings has to be rethought in the current phase based on the evaluation results.</li> <li>Kristina informs that the CoPs in CA have been rethought together with partner organizations based on the reflection workshops of the evaluation; there were 3 CoPs on youth, rural families and women; it was decided in the end of 2018 to have only 2 from now on: 1 in the sector Rural development: rural families, focus agroecology; 1 in the sector Human rights, focus social communication</li> <li>Clemens wants to know whether in EA too there were kick-off workshops held in order to tailor a programme that meets the needs of the organisations, since this was done in CA. KK mentions that in EA the number of partners is a big challenge; also the Kick-Off sessions in CA treated the ADA framework programme in CA as a whole, not only KH3000, in EA this is no practice so far.</li> <li>After members of the committee emphasis the evaluation finding that partners do not know what KH3000 is, KK raises the question whether it is really necessary for partners to understand the concept/objective of the global KH3000 programme in order to benefit from the programme → All the attendees find a consensus that it is more important for partners to develop an understanding on KM in general, and not</li> </ul>
