





KM Assessment as an instrument to measure KM performance





0 =to an extent insufficient for the operation in the process

Extent of Human Resource Availability: local: 0.75 1 = to an extent sufficient for operation, but unsatisfying in time or cost or quality

Extent of Structure Resource Availability: 1,50 2 =to an extent sufficient for operation on a satisfactory level

Extent of Relationship Resource Availability: 2,25 3 = to an extent as needed for excellent operations


