What is it about?

"PNG Studies" - preparing university students for participation in PNG's development.

Why an intervention?

The PNG Studies program supports students in order to develop a deep understanding of the political, socio-economic, judicial, and religious traditions of the diverse communities of PNG, to help understand the effects of rapid exposure to the outside world, and to learn develop solutions for themselves and their communities to manage the change.

What does it change?

- Preparation of students for jobs in an active civil society (e.g. NGOs and/ or HORIZONT3000 partners/ programmes)
- Increases the number of female actors in PNG's civil society (majority of students is female)
- Favours a positive attitude towards common national objectives, while preserving and enhancing the positive relationship with students communities of origin
